Maths

Times tables

In Year 5, children will continue to build on their times tables knowledge from the test they completed in Year 4.

Children will be expected to know their 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 multiplication and division facts, and will be using them for long multiplication (for example 3805 x 27) and short division (389 / 8).

We will still be doing TTRS in school and I would encourage them to continue practising at home, too.

PE

In Year 5, children have swimming lessons on Monday afternoons during the Autumn and Spring term (up until the Easter holidays). Please help children to remember their kits on these days to prevent any panic!

Unfortunately, due to timetabling, these will be our only PE lessons in the Autumn and Spring term. However, in the Summer, children will begin 'in-school' PE lessons with Miss Keating as swimming lessons will have finished. These will be on a Monday and Friday.

Children will need to have their kit in for these days; preferably a t-shirt, shorts, tracksuit bottoms, a jumper and pumps/ trainers.

Bags

Although we have quite a big classroom, our cloakroom pegs are quite cramped, and we don't have much space for fitting things on them. Please can children only bring in **small**, **compact drawstring bags**, as larger bags don't fit on the pegs very well.

If your son/ daughter needs a larger bag because they are going somewhere after school, they can keep it at the front of the classroom for the day.



Reading

Reading bags will need to be brought into school every Friday (or Thursday if you'd like to be prepared!) They will be changed and sent home every Friday.

Children need to read at least 3x I0-minute sessions per week (2x I5-minute sessions or Ix 30-minute session is also fine).

In Year 5, children will be expected to write in their reading diary themselves, rather than an adult writing for them. This should be a short piece of information about what they have read, each time they read. An example has been stuck in the front of your son/ daughter's reading diary.

Homework

Homework will be assigned every Friday and is due back in by the following Wednesday. If it is not completed at home, it will be completed at break/lunch time.

Homework should be completed to a high standard, including being presented neatly.

Homework will be sent home as a paper copy. Please help children to begin organising themselves so they remember their homework (hopefully independently!) each week.

Spellings

I0 spellings will be sent home every Friday alongside homework. Spellings are part of the homework, meaning this sheet will also need to be brought back.

Once the spellings have been sent out on the Friday, a spelling lesson will be done on the Monday to learn about any spelling patterns and practise them.

An informal check will then be done the following Friday before new ones are assigned.

Please encourage your son/daughter to practice their spellings at home!

School Street

We are hoping to continue with the school street initiative this year to prevent congestion and make the bottom of the avenue safer for children.

This means the bottom of Old Brow will still be closed to vehicles during drop off and pick up times.
