
Topic – Bears, Bears, Bears!

Our new topic this half term is all about Bears. We will be reading lots of Bear books including "We're Going on a Bear Hunt" and "Goldilocks and the Three Bears".

We will also be talking about different bears e.g. Polar Bears, Grizzly (Brown) Bears and Panda Bears. Where do they live? What do they like to eat? What do they look like?

We are building an outdoor bear cave with the children to support our role play.

At the end of this topic, we will have our very own Teddy Bears Picnic at school.



Monster Phonics

The children are really enjoying our Monster Phonics Program. We will be continuing to listen and identify sounds all around us. We will also start to think about rhythm and rhyme and then moving onto alliteration (for example the big, brown bear or silly, stripy socks).

We will be talking about the sounds we can hear at the beginning of words.
