Reception Baseline


 The RBA is a short, interactive and practical assessment of your child's early literacy, communication, language and mathematics skills when they begin school. It became statutory for all schools from September 2021. The data from the assessment will only be used by the Department for Education when your child has reached the end of year 6, to provide the baseline to measure the progress of your child's year group from reception to year 6. The data from the assessment, including numerical scores, is not shared with you, pupils, teachers, or external bodies, including schools, and there will be no published scores at pupil, school or national level

Lunchtime

Phonics is a way of teaching children to read and write and it is taught daily in our EYFS (Nursery and Reception) and Key Stage 1 (Year 1 and 2) classes. The children are taught in small groups and the sessions are fun and active. We follow the 'Letters and Sounds' phase progression to teach Phonics at Livingstone.

Phonics teaches children to:

- tune into sounds
- •recognise the sounds (phonemes) that each individual letter and combinations of letters make
- •blend sounds together to read words
- segment words for spelling
- •tricky words (the, no, go, to)
- Articulation of sounds

- The children will bring home phonics books once they have been taught the first set of sounds (s, a, t, p, i, n).
- The children will be able to sound out and blend the sounds together to read the words.
- We ask that the children read their book at least 3 times at home in order to become confident and independent in their reading.
- When the children are writing, we expect them to write using their phonic knowledge. Therefore, words will be phonetically plausible and not necessarily spelt correctly e.g. 'tighm' for 'time' or 'dai' for 'day.'



Handwriting

- When children are writing we encourage them to hold their pen/pencil correctly and it is important that they start their letters in the correct place.
- We encourage the children to sit up straight at the table when they are writing.
