SchoolGrid school meal ordering and payment system:

Each family has been sent an email link to log into SchoolGrid, our new system for ordering and paying for school dinners. If your children have school dinners (rather than packed lunch) you need to create an account on SchoolGrid to select food options. Please order with your child(ren) so that they can tell you which things they like to eat. This will now replace the paper menu system.

If you pay for your child's school dinners, from Monday 19th January, SchoolGrid will replace School Spider as the place to do this.

You can order on a daily, weekly, monthly or even termly basis. The system will allow you to place as many orders in advance as you like, up to the point the menu has been opened for. You can also make a same-day order up to 8:55am.

If you pay for your child's meals you have two options on SchoolGrid:

1. Top up your account by making a **Card Payment**
2. Set up a **Direct Debit**.

To place an order, you need to have credit on your account or a Direct Debit set up. If you do not have these, you will be unable to order and will receive a reminder message to make payment.

With Direct Debit, SchoolGrid collects the payment on a monthly basis in arrears. Your Direct Debit amount can vary depending on the amount of meals taken within the period so a statement will be sent to you two weeks prior to the collection, detailing the exact date and the amount to be collected, as well as all the meals included.

Please remember to cancel your order if your child will not be having the meal at lunchtime (eg if they are unwell and not in school), otherwise you may still be charged. This also helps cut down on food wastage.

If you are having any problems with the system please let us know so that we can try to resolve them today before going live on Monday. SchoolGrid support can be contacted via email on support@schoolgrid.co.uk or by telephone on 01506 300310.

School Dinner Debts:

As we move over to the new system, any outstanding debt money for school dinners will be chased. When you get this message please continue to pay the debt on School Spider only: use School Grid to pay for meals from Monday 19th January onwards.
