EYFS: Apple Blossom have had a very busy and active few weeks! The children have been on an Autumn walk and collected apples, which were then washed and eaten for snack. The new bikes arrived and the children have been practising their balancing skills to ride them. Thank you for all of the baby photos sent into school. The children really had fun working out who was who. They also chatted about similarities and differences between how they looked then compared to now.

Year 1: What a wonderful October Year 1 have had. The children have loved junk modelling their boats. They have written their own retelling of Lost and Found, they worked incredibly hard! This week we have been super chefs making 'the best fruit salad ever' and then master artist learning about colour mixing and putting it into practice painting a rainbow.

Lastly, the children have thoroughly enjoyed our learning around forces and have loved completing different experiments and investigations to find the answers to some tricky questions. Year 6: The children in Oak Class have had a busy start to the year. We all enjoyed our trip to Chester Military Museum – we handled many artefacts from the Second World War and enjoyed looking at all the displays both inside and outside.
