Curriculum Overview



Physical Development

- Continue to develop their fine and gross movements.
- Show a preference for a dominant hand.
- Be increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed, for example, putting coat/jumper/cardigan on.

Communication and Language

- En joy listening to stories and can remember much of what happens.
 - Pay attention to more than one thing at a time, which can be difficult.
 - Develop their communication.
 - Use talk to organise themselves and their play.

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

- Selects and uses activities and resources independently.
- Plays with others, extending and elaborating play ideas.
- Showing more independence over their self-care and hygiene without adult reminders and prompts (toilet, hand washing etc)







Expressive Arts and Design

- Create closed shapes with continuous lines, and begin to use these shapes to represent objects.
- Draw with increasing complexity and detail, such as representing a face with a circle and including details.
- Explore different materials freely, to develop their ideas about how to use them and what to make

Literacy

- Use some of their print and letter knowledge in their early writing.
- Begin to develop their phonological awareness.
- Begin to recognise and write some letters of their name.

Maths

- Able to recognise, count, match numeral and quantity for numbers upto 6.
- Show finger numbers upto 6.
- Make simple comparisons between objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity.
- Explores making mathematical marks (numbers/symbols).
