- · Can I evaluate different viewpoints about the implications of changing weather patterns on the people of Greenland?
- · Can I explain how global warming is affecting weather around the world?

- · That drawing can be used to transform a two dimensional surface, which can be manipulated to make a three dimensional
- That when we transform two dimensional surfaces we can use line, mark making, value, shape, colour, pattern and composition to help us create our artwork.
- That we can use methods such as the grid method and looking at negative space to help us draw.
- That there is a challenge involved in bringing two dimensions to 3 dimensions which we can solve with a combination of invention and logic.

- Can I use a text-based 'adventure'?











Children will continue to have independent reading books to take home and they will begin to access the school library. Reading books can be changed ANY day, as needed.


Reading records will be checked daily, and the expectation is that the children will read every single night; please support and encourage them in doing so.

Home Learning

Reading: Your child should read their reading book each night and have their reading record updated daily to reflect the reading that has been done: this will be checked daily.

Spellings: The statutory spelling list for 5 and 6 is attached, these can be practised to help support in class work and end of year expectations.

Maths: A maths worksheet will be sent home each Friday with answers sent home via email: this does not need to be returned to school.

Children also have access to online learning platforms that can be used at home.
