


Reception Newsletter

Curriculum Overview



Communication and Language

- Use longer sentences of four to six words.
- Understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important.
- Listen carefully to rhymes and songs, paying attention to how they sound.
- Listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding.
- Use new vocabulary through the day in different contexts.
- Listen and respond to questions about key texts.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Manage their own needs.
- See themselves as a valuable individual.
- Express their feelings and consider the feelings of others.
- Build constructive and respectful relationships.
- Identify and moderate their own feelings socially and emotionally.
- Show resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge.

Physical Development

- Be increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed, for example, putting coats on and doing up zips.
- Use their core muscle strength to achieve a good posture when sitting at a table or sitting on the floor.
- Develop their fine motor skills so that they can use a range of tools competently, safely and confidently.
- Revise and refine the fundamental movement skills they have already acquired.







Curriculum Overview



Literacy

- Develop their phonological awareness, so that they can:
- ✓ spot and suggest rhymes
- count or clap syllables in a word
- recognise words with the same initial sound
- Write some letters accurately.
- Write some or all of their name.
- Read individual letters by saying the sounds for them.
- Blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words made up of known letter-sound correspondences.

Mathematics

- Shape (2D and 3D)
- Change within 5 (I more and I less)
- Number bonds within 5 (part whole model)
- Spatial awareness (positional language - in, on, below, under, up, down, across)

Understanding the World

- Talk about members of their immediate family and community.
- Name and describe people who are familiar to them.
- Recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Explore, use and refine a variety of artistic effects to express their ideas and feelings.
- Create collaboratively sharing ideas, resources and skills.







Children will continue to bring home a reading record and book for you to share and enjoy together at home. This needs to be brought in everyday so that your child can read with a member of staff. Books will be changed every Monday and Thursday.

To help support a love of reading at home, your child will also receive a special 'bedtime story' book each week. This is for you to enjoy together at a quiet time, such as before bed.

To further support independent reading for pleasure, take a look at the suggestions below that are linked to the topics and authors we are focusing on this half term. All of these books can be found on Youtube to listen to at home if you do not have access to a physical copy.



Home Learning

Our Home learning at the moment is reading and phonics based. We encourage you to read every evening with your child. This should only be for 5-10 minutes in order to keep reading enjoyable and fun.

I will also continue to send out links to phonics videos and games for you to watch together at home. These videos aim to consolidate the sounds we have learnt together in school.

I send these out via Class Dojo. Please make sure you check Dojo regularly.





Children also have access to online learning platforms that can be used at home.
