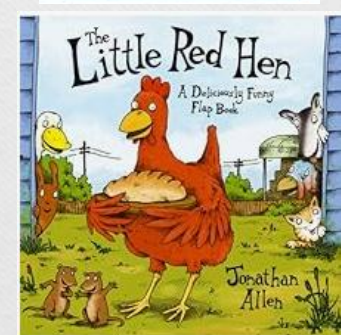
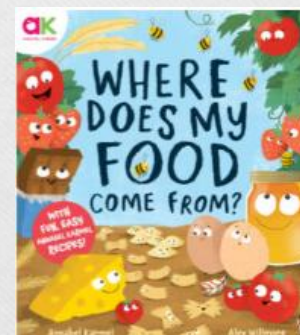


PE Kits **MUST** be brought to school every Monday and taken home Friday

After listening to parent/carer feedback, we have made some slight changes to home learning for this year.

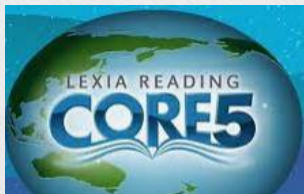
English
