


Curriculum Overview

English

Lila and the Secret of Rain

- Instructions
- Recount
- Narrative

Maths

Money

- Recognise and use symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p); combine amounts to make a particular value.
- Recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes.
- Find different combinations of coins that equal the same amounts of money.
- Solve simple problems in a practical context involving addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change.

Multiplication and Division

- Solve problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition, mental methods, and multiplication and division facts, including problems in contexts.
- Calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division within the multiplication tables and write them using the multiplication (×), division (÷) and equals (=) signs.

Science

Living things and habitats

- Explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive.
- Identify most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants and how they depend on each other.
- Identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitat, including microhabitats.
- Describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain and identify and name different sources of food.

Geography

'How does the geography of Kampong Ayer compare with the geography of where I live?'

- **Identify and describe** the location of where they live in the UK, within Europe and the world;
- **Compare** their own location with the location of Kampong Ayer in the country of Brunei within Asia and also both locations in relation to the Equator and the north and south poles;
- Using maps, **identify** time differences and **estimate** distances between the UK and Brunei and between the UK, Brunei and other locations in the world;
- **Identify, describe** and **observe** the types of traditional homes found in Kampong Ayer and **compare and contrast** these with their own homes;
- **Identify and describe** the main elements which make up the weather and **understand** that weather conditions change from one moment to the next;
- **Observe** how, generally, temperature decreases towards the north and south poles and increases towards the Equator and suggest **reasons** for this pattern;
- **Identify and describe** appropriate forms of transport for particular journeys made and **explain** why boats and water taxis are used by almost everyone in Kampong Ayer;
- **Recognise, describe** and suggest **reasons** for the similarities between a school/ school life in one school in Kampong Ayer and their own school;
- **Identify and describe** the structure of typical tropical rainforest in Brunei and **describe**, offer **reasons** and **explain** how living things in tropical rainforests are adapted to cope in extreme heat and rain.

Art

Expressive Painting

- See how artists sometimes use paint in an expressive, loose way to create paintings full of life and colour.
- Recognise primary colours and mix secondary colours, experimenting with hues by changing the amount of primary colours I add.
- Use various home made tools to apply paint in abstract patterns.
- Use gestural mark making with paint, and incorporate the colours and shapes in the still life to make an expressive painting.









PE Kits **MUST** be brought to school every Monday and taken home Friday.

Home Learning


English
