Science

- identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution.

Geography

- Can I observe and record the common key natural features of the National Parks of the UK and explain why they are referred to as the country's 'breathing spaces'?
- Can I recognise those other special qualities of 'cultural heritage' and reflect on the importance of their own cultural heritage in the context of this?

Art

I can share my response to their work with my classmates.

- I can use my sketchbook to record, generate ideas, test, reflect and record.





- Can I link these with a career?
