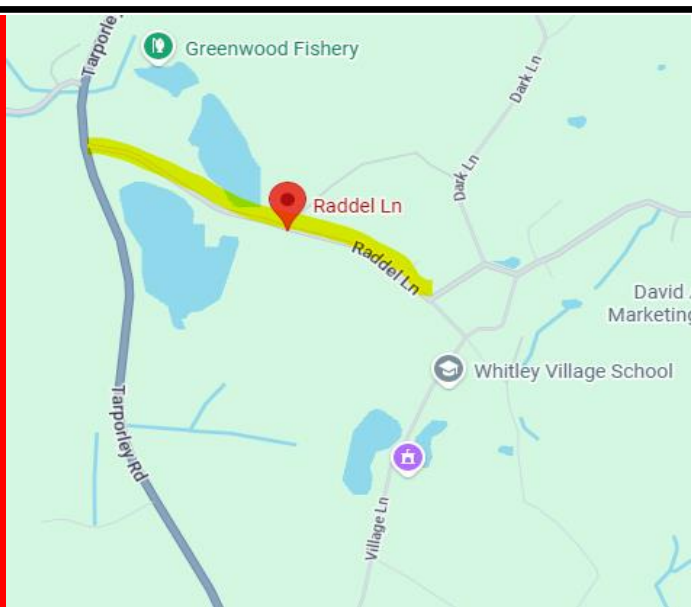
HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY 2026

Use of WhatsApp



It has come to my attention that some children in Class 3 are using WhatsApp. This app is intended for users aged 13 and over, and therefore should not be used by anyone still in primary school. Nationally, WhatsApp use by younger children frequently leads to significant pastoral issues due to inappropriate or unmonitored communication. If your child has WhatsApp installed on their phone, I would politely ask that you delete it so we can avoid the well-documented problems associated with its use. More generally, we will shortly be issuing a Smart Phone Policy once it has been approved by our Governing Body; in the meantime, all smart phones must be handed into the school office as soon as your child arrives.

National Curriculum News

The current National Curriculum for children in Years 1 to 6 was introduced in 2014, and the world has changed dramatically since then, bringing with it many new challenges and priorities. Following a government review, a panel has now been appointed to draft updated Programmes of Study for Key Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2) and Key Stage 2 (Years 3 to 6). They will also update KS3 for those entering secondary school. The final versions are expected to be published in spring 2027, with the new curriculum scheduled to be taught in schools from September 2028.

The children of Class 3 enjoyed an immersive and memorable tour of the Stockport Air Raid Shelter. Upon their arrival, they were greeted by a guide dressed in authentic 1940s attire, immediately transporting them back in time. Throughout the visit, the children learned about the experiences of the civilian population of Stockport during the Second World War.

Civilians on both sides of the conflict endured tremendous hardships and showed a level of stoic resilience that is difficult to comprehend in the modern age. This educational experience added an exciting and meaningful dimension to the children's current whole-class text in English, while also bringing to life their study of World War Two in history.

The visit not only deepened their understanding but also sparked curiosity, empathy, and a greater appreciation of the past.
