## Changes to Sports Premium Funding



The Government has announced major changes to Sports Premium Funding, due to take effect from Spring 2027. These changes are expected to significantly impact schools like ours, which currently use the funding to provide a wide range of sporting and outdoor opportunities.

At present, the funding allows us to choose our own providers, offering activities such as yoga and football clubs at a reduced cost. It has also helped subsidise outdoor education on residential trips, including activities like orienteering, climbing, and mountain biking—meaning parents do not pay the full cost.

Under the new proposals, funding may become more centralised, with less flexibility over providers. In addition, reports suggest overall funding could be reduced by around 22%.

As a result, the cost of the Year 2/3 and Year 6 residentials may rise in future years, and the range of enrichment activities—such as fencing and other specialist sports—may be affected.

We remain committed to providing enriching experiences and will share further updates as more details become available.

### Education Secretary Warns Overprotective Parenting Leaves Children Unprepared For Their Future



Education Secretary Bridget Phillipson has stressed the importance of balancing support with resilience in children's development, warning against overprotective approaches that leave young people unprepared for real life.

She said she was determined not to "let a generation be written off," but emphasised that this could not be achieved "by promising young people a world without hardship."

Highlighting the dual role of guidance and challenge, Ms Phillipson explained: "Every parent wants their child to get the help they need when they struggle. We also want them to grow strong enough to meet what life throws at them... Help and strength are not in competition. A child needs both."

Her comments reflect growing concern about the impact of overly protective parenting. She added:

"Coddling children won't help them – it just leaves them less able to cope with the world we are preparing them for. I want them ready for the difficulties that life will hand them, not shielded from it altogether."
