Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for your kindness, your encouragement, your friendship and your unwavering support for the school.

From September 2026
National eligibility criteria for Free School Meals (FSM) is expanding.

All households receiving Universal Credit will now qualify.

Parking Passes

We would like to remind all parents/carers that the school car park and the area just outside are **strictly for staff parking only at all times** unless you have a parking pass (issued by the school office) or a valid disabled badge displayed. What to do if you see someone in trouble in the water

Shout

- Are you in trouble?
- Can you swim - swim towards me?
- Can you stand up?
- Can you float on your back?



Reach

- Use an object like sticks, something you can let go of if you become in danger yourself
- Lie down or crouch so you are not pulled into the water



Throw

- What can we throw to them?
- Anything that floats and can be held onto to keep them above water
- Throwlines (floating lines)
- Footballs
- Rings



Don't go!

- **Do not be tempted to enter the water.** Keep eyes on the casualty and call 999.
- Try to give the best location or use What3Words.

TOP SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

☀️ Wear a life jacket when boating or paddleboarding



☀️ Never jump into unknown water

☀️ Stay away from flooded areas and fast-moving water



☀️ Listen to lifeguards and warning signs

☀️ Keep hydrated and protect yourself from the sun



WATER RISKS AND HAZARDS TO LOOK OUT FOR

Rivers and Canals

- ⚠ Strong currents can pull you under
- ⚠ Slippery banks make it hard to climb out
- ⚠ Water may be deeper than it looks



Lakes, Reservoirs and Open Water

- ⚠ Water stays cold even in hot weather
- ⚠ Hidden objects may be under the surface
- ⚠ Steep sides can make exiting difficult

Beaches and the Sea

- ⚠ Waves and tides can change quickly
- ⚠ Rip currents can pull swimmers away from shore
- ⚠ Always swim at lifeguarded beaches if possible



REMEMBER

FLOAT TO LIVE

Cold water shock can happen suddenly, even on warm days. If you unexpectedly fall into water:

- ✓ Tilt your head back with your ears underwater
- ✓ Relax and try to control your breathing
- ✓ Move your hands to help you stay afloat
- ✓ Spread your arms and legs out like a starfish
- ✓ Once calm, call for help or swim to safety if possible



If you see someone in trouble in the water:

- ✗ **Do not jump in after them**
- ✓ Call 999 and ask for the Coastguard, Fire Service or Police
- ✓ Throw something that floats to help them

Staying Safe Around Water This Summer

As the summer holidays approach, the Cheshire Water Safety Group is supporting schools to help children and families stay safe around water.

This newsletter has been designed for KS2 pupils and can be shared before the end of the academic year to help educate children about the risks of water and how to enjoy outdoor activities safely.

The information below includes key safety messages from the RNLI, RLSS, Canals & River Trust and Cheshire Fire & Rescue Service - key messages include the Float to Live campaign, the Water Safety Code & Cheshire Fire & Rescue Service water safety hierarchy and the Explorers. Water Safety Code



STOP AND

THINK

- Before going near water
- Look for warning signs
- Check for dangers
- Always go with an adult

STAY

TOGETHER

- Never swim alone
- Keep friends and family nearby
- Tell an adult where you are going

FLOAT TO

LIVE

- Tilt your head back with your ears underwater
- Relax and try to control your breathing
- Move your hands to help you stay afloat
- Spread your arms and legs out like a starfish
- Once called for help or swim for safety if possible

IN AN

EMERGENCY

- Call 999 immediately
- Shout for help
- Use a float or throwers if available

When Something Goes Wrong Online — A Simple Action Plan for Parents





- 1. Stay Calm First**
If your child tells you something worrying:
 - Thank them for telling you
 - Avoid blaming or panicking
 - Reassure them: "We'll deal with this together."
- 2. Keep the Evidence**
 - Take screenshots (include usernames and dates)
 - Save messages
 - Keep profile links
- 3. Use Official Reporting Routes**
Grooming or exploitation – CEOP: www.ceop.police.uk/safety-centre
Illegal images – Internet Watch Foundation: www.iwf.org.uk/report
Nude images shared (under 18s) – Report Remove: www.childline.org.uk/info-advice/bullying-abuse-safety/online-mobile-safety/report-remove
If in immediate danger, call 999.
- 4. If You Feel Overwhelmed – Use Structured Support**
You can use free ChatGPT to help structure next steps.  ChatGPT
Free access: <https://chat.openai.com> Example prompts:
 - My child received inappropriate messages. What steps should I take in the UK?
 - How do I report online grooming?
 - What should I say to my child after cyberbullying?
 Important: ChatGPT is a support tool and does NOT replace official reporting or police action.
- 5. Ongoing Protection at Home**
 - Keep regular, calm conversations
 - Review privacy settings together
 - Monitor gaming contacts
 - Encourage early disclosure
 Children will make mistakes online, just as they do offline.
Trust and communication protect them more than punishment.

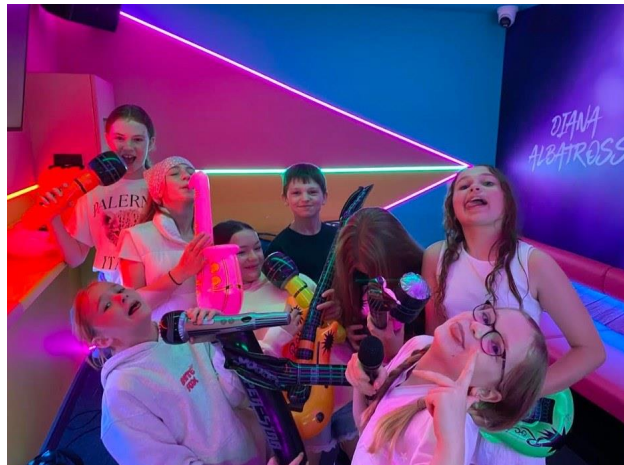




Year 6 End of Year Trip

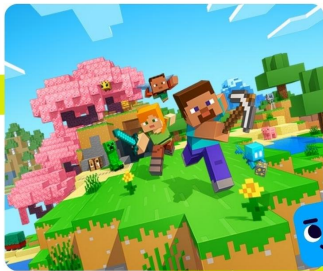

FRENCH CLUB AT OUGHTRINGTON



About the French Club

Les Copains is a French club that runs every Thursday after school. We introduce French in a fun way by exploring the language through games and activities. Sessions are designed using detailed lesson plans that are structured to stimulate children's natural enthusiasm for language. At Key Stage Two the focus shifts towards writing skills and grammar although the emphasis remains on learning in a fun and stimulating way.

The Les Copains formula has proved to be hugely popular with children of all ages and ability. It doesn't matter if your child has had no previous exposure to the French language, the programme is designed with a lot of repetition and children soon pick up the basics from the activities.

Our three stages approach to learning begins in pre-school at age 3. It's never too early to introduce a second language, in fact, research has shown the earlier the better.
