## Filming and Photographs on School Premises

To help safeguard all children and protect the wider school community, we politely remind parents, children and visitors that you must not take photographs or record videos while on school premises without prior permission, this includes the playgrounds at pick-up and drop-off time. This applies to all devices, including cameras, mobile phones, smart glasses, and any other recording equipment.



## Personal Toys and Belongings

Could we please remind parents that children should not bring personal belongings such as toys, fidgets, books and teddy bears into school.



Each class in school has soft toys, books and fidget toys that the children can access if and when necessary during their school day.

Following the amazing generosity of our parents at last October's non uniform day, which raised funds for lunchtime toys and equipment, both the Infants and Juniors have a fantastic selection of activities and toys to keep them entertained over lunchtime — thank you.

Our Rainbow Room is also fully equipped with mindfulness resources for children of all ages.

Unfortunately, school is unable to take any responsibility for any personal items a child may bring into school that are misplaced, lost or damaged.

Please could we also remind parents and carers to ensure that all items of clothing worn for school are labelled with your child's name, including shoes — quite often children do have the same style.

Sports kits brought into school for after school clubs must also be clearly labelled with your child's name and placed in a named bag.

To avoid confusion at lunchtime, please could all lunch bags be labelled as children occasionally have the same one. In the interest of health and safety this also applies to the labelling of water bottles brought into class.

Could we please also remind parents and carers that if children are off school following sickness or diarrhoea they must remain off school for 48 hours following the last incident.

## Contacting Class Teachers



As parents and carers will be aware, we have an open door policy here at St Luke's School.

If you would like to talk to your child's class teacher, either before or after school, please contact the school office to make an appointment.

If you have an urgent message that needs relaying to your child's teacher at the start of the day, this can also be done via the school office so that the class and teacher can begin their day on time.

Could we please remind parents and carers that if you have an important message regarding your child that you should always contact the school office rather than using class DOJO, for example a change in pick up and collection arrangements.

If a teacher is off site, in a meeting or busy teaching their class they may not see the DOJO message until much later. It could take up to two school days for a DOJO to be responded to.

We would also like to ask that DOJO messages are not sent to class teachers during the evening, we appreciate that this is usually when parents are at home, but it can also be quite disruptive to our teachers family time.

Please note that you must notify the school office of all absences, appointments and holiday requests, these must not be sent via class DOJO.

- 2) Entries must be no larger than a cereal box or shoe box.**
- 3) Each entry should be clearly labelled with a title, your child's name, and class.**
- 4) We are kindly asking for an entry fee donation (any amount is greatly received) which will go towards art and craft resources for each class.**

**Please bring your donation, along with the children's creations, into your child's classroom on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> March. All entries will be displayed in the hall after school until 3:45pm if parents or carers would like to view the designs.**
