HEALTHY BREAKTIME SNACKS & NUT FREE SCHOOL

Fresh fruit is provided by the Council as a breaktime snack for Reception, Y1 & Y2 as a Government Healthy Eating incentive, however from Y3 upwards we encourage parents to send in a healthy snack to bridge the hunger gap from breakfast to lunchtime. We would like to request this to be fruit/veg or a low sugar cereal bar for example, rather than a packet of crisps – if possible.

PLEASE NOTE: We have children in school who suffer from SEVERE nut allergies.

We cannot stress enough the severity of these allergies that could have **very serious results** should they even come in to contact with nuts to the touch, let alone digest them. Please consider this carefully when sending snacks.



Kits by County.

At the end of last term, we signed up to the "Kits by County" campaign. Stockport County FC and Stockport County Community Trust were offering schools in Stockport the opportunity to apply for a number of PE kits to support our families in need.

Our school uniform PE policy is plain white t-shirt, plain black/navy shorts, black/navy sweatshirt (no hoodies) & tracksuit bottoms in the colder weather plus black pumps/trainers for outside sports.

However, this campaign has been more than just kit. Every child identified as needing support now has the opportunity to take part in PE with confidence – and perhaps even become the next superstar from Stockport.

By removing the barrier of kit, Stockport County Football Club are also helping schools boost participation. Since the launch of Kits by County in 2024, local schools have seen more pupils engaging in PE. Teachers have also reported that children who were previously missing school entirely on PE days due to stigma are now attending – meaning the initiative is having a wider benefit on attendance and academic attainment too.

These kits are available to any children in school of families who may be struggling with the cost of living and the financial cost of purchasing a PE kit. Please contact the Office directly.
