## History

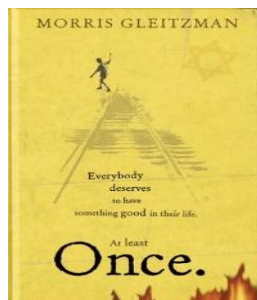
