

Welcome to the Broadstone Hall Primary School Newsletter!

HEADTEACHERS NOTE: Dear Parents/Carers, As you may have noticed, several trees were removed over the half-term break. This work has been commissioned and funded by Stockport Council due to the health and safety risks posed by the tree roots. The removal forms the first phase of a wider improvement project.

The second phase will involve excavating the area where the trees previously stood, removing all disrupted ground and exposed roots, and levelling the surface with new tarmac. Kerbs will also be removed. **Once completed, this will provide a safer, more even surface and significantly increase the space available for children to play and move around. These improvements will enhance the quality and usability of our outdoor environment.**
