HEADTEACHERS NOTE:

You may have seen on this summer term's calendar listings there are several **Mental Health, Worry Workshops** and **Wellbeing Courses** are scattered in there.

SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD'S MENTAL HEALTH IN SCHOOL

We have joined together with other Stockport schools to create a partnership with **The Schools Mental Health Support Team**, who offer various support within schools;

Their 3 main functions are to:

1. Offer 1:1 or group interventions (both require consultations and suitability assessments)
2. To work closely with the SENCO and Safeguarding Lead to identify "whole school" themes - this can range from whole class **SATS Worry Workshops** to general coping strategies for children on a daily basis.
3. Signposts to other services for children, young people, families and staff.

MHST EMHP practitioners provide short-term, CBT-informed, low-intensity interventions for young people in school. We support young people through assessment, formulation, psychoeducation, and brief treatment.

WHAT DOES THIS ALL MEAN FOR YOUR CHILD?

Your child will meet **Lina (our assigned MHST practitioner)** during an assembly on Friday where she will introduce herself and the work she does.

Your child may have been involved in the SATS worry workshops held in all Year 6 classes this week. Lina will also be visiting all classes Y1-5 over the next term doing workshops in classes around "their worries."

Some children might work in small groups or 1:1 with Lina helping address more specific mental health issues. *(These will be referral basis only; with parental permission/consultation.)*

Additionally, Stockport County Community Trust will be conducting 6 classroom sessions during Summer (2) supporting our Y6 children. These workshops are aimed to help develop their knowledge and understanding around mental health and

encouraging them to recognise positive behaviours that they can employ to promote improved mental wellbeing for themselves and others.

During the sessions, the class will explore some of the challenges they are likely to face in the coming years as they grow up and consider effective strategies they can use along the way. Every workshop delivered will be alongside a practical PE session led by the Stockport County staff and linked to the core themes of the programme.
