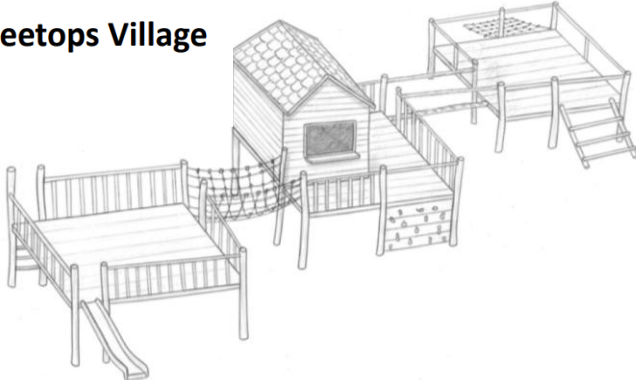


Welcome to the Broadstone Hall

HEADTEACHERS NOTE:

It's the 1st of May and we have some **VERY** exciting news!
We have commissioned a new adventure Treetops Village & Play Area for our school! Here is a mock up design:

Treetops Village



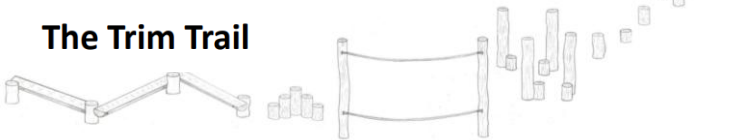
The intention is to develop a play area that is accessible & engaging for all our students, situated on the grass between the MUGA pitch and the playground.

The plan is to create a series of interlinking platforms at three different heights. The gradient of the land allows for an exciting, multi-level play experience that encourages **exploration, imagination** and **physical development**.



And that's not all...a **Trim Trail** will lead to the platform area creating a playful entry point into a wider play space!

The Trim Trail



The trim trail will include a **wire-reinforced rope slackline** – perfect for younger children to crawl along & for older ones to challenge their coordination and balance. This will lead onto a series of **stepping stones**, weaving through **slalom posts**, followed by a **wire-reinforced rope walk**, an **up-and-over stepping hill**, & finish with **extended balance beams**.
