Our story focus this week has been "What's in the Witch's Kitchen?" by Nick Sharratt. The children really enjoyed exploring this imaginative story and thinking carefully about the main character. During **Drawing Club**, we discussed what we might like to eat from the witch's kitchen – and what we definitely would not! There were some very funny and creative ideas, including how many rabbit plops the children would dare to eat! We also thought about how we might escape from the witch's kitchen if we found ourselves inside. The children drew detailed pictures and used their phonics skills to write magic code words.

In maths, we have been learning to compare amounts using the language *more than, fewer than* and *the same as*. The children have been using practical resources such as counters, cubes, and toys to make comparisons and explain their thinking. They are becoming more confident in using mathematical vocabulary to describe what they see.

Other Learning

In Music, we have been learning new songs and poems for Halloween, which the children have really enjoyed performing together. In RE, the children created beautiful Rangoli patterns as part of our learning about Diwali, exploring colour, shape, and symmetry. During PE, we have been practising our ball skills, developing control, coordination, and teamwork.

Today, we have also had great fun taking part in **Jayne's Journey** by wearing **purple** and enjoying a range of fun activities together.
