

Look our for our Attendance Champions on the playground each day before school - they are there to promote and celebrate positive attendance each day.







Reading Superstars



Keep your child fit and healthy this flu season with the flu vaccination- it's one of the best ways to keep them healthy, reduce missed school days, protect their classmates and the whole family.

Flu can spread quickly, but vaccination helps build a strong shield of protection around our children, their classmates, teachers, and loved ones.

The school Immunisation team will be visiting school on Friday 21st November 20205 and vaccines are available for all school-aged children and 2-3-year-olds. The nasal spray is quick and painless, with an injectable option if preferred.







The staff were very grateful.






Remembrance Day
