Units of Learning

The EYFS framework is structured very differently to the National Curriculum as it is organised across seven areas of learning (Three specific and four prime areas) rather than subject areas. (Our curriculum follows <u>Development Matters</u> 2020). These are taught partially through daily routines and continuous provision (independent learning time). Children have the opportunities to engage in adult planned activities or can lead their own activities. We also have lots of time for children to talk about their own experiences. EYFS staff use effective questioning and modelling to encourage children to use the appropriate language and encourage children to develop and show the Effective Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning.
