Phonics

In Autumn 2, children will start to learn Phase 2 phonics following the Little Wandles phonic scheme. Each week you child will have home learning to practice the new phonemes (sounds) they have learnt.



Fine Motor skills and writing

We will start the term looking at pre-writing skills.
