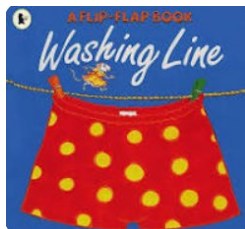
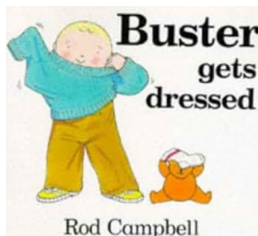


In Autumn 1 we will be focusing on welcoming our older children back to nursery and settling our new children in. We will be supporting everyone to make friends and feel happy and secure.

- Play some of the number games and sing the number rhymes sent home by nursery.

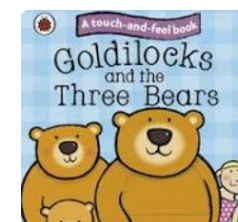
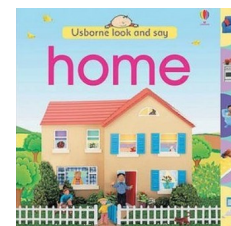

Spring 2 words:
