

Phonics

The children will be baselined over the next couple of days so that we can see if there are any areas that we need to work on.

On Friday (5/09) the children will be sent home with the last book that they had in EYFS (Sleep Well) as this will be a refresh and a consolidation of the sounds as well as easing them into Year 1.

Phonics will be starting on Monday 8th September therefore a new decodable reader plus one additional reader will be given on Friday 12th September.



Phonics and reading

Reading regularly helps children:

- Build vocabulary
- ·Improve their understanding of the world around them
- Develop their imagination and creativity
- Strengthen their speaking and listening skills
- Boost confidence and independence

Phonics gives children the tools to read, and regular reading helps those tools become strong and automatic.

At this stage, your support at home is essential. Sharing books together, listening to your child read aloud, and encouraging a love of stories all make a huge difference. Reading just a little every day can have a big impact.

We will collect your child's reading books every **Thursday** so they can be changed on a Friday. On a **Friday**, your child will bring home a **decodable reader** (matched to their current phonics learning) along with **an additional reading book** to enjoy. From the **Spring term onwards**, children will bring home their **decodable reader plus two additional reading books** each week.



Reading diaries

- The children have been sent home with a zippy bag and a reading diary inside, these reading diaries are not being used as a form of communication they must only have reading signatures in them to show that the child has been read to/with at home.
- These will be checked on a Friday by a member of staff.

Communication

Homework

We see homework as an opportunity for your child to further embed their learning and apply their learning to contexts outside of school. We really appreciate your support with this.

Reading/ Phonics (fluency)

*Please record and sign all instances of reading that take place at home. A minimum of 4 signatures per week are required in diaries but daily reading is recommended where possible.

4 x 10 minutes (decodable reader)

Daily reading (levelled reading book or Accelerated Reader book within ZPD range). *Post phonics screening check in the summer term of y1.

*It is also useful for children to be read to by parents e.g. bedtime story which allows children to have lots of exposure to modelling of tone, intonation, expression, etc.

The decodable readers have questions to discuss at the end of each book.

Class teachers will share a 4 x 2 homework grid at the end of each half term ready for the next half term. All of the activities are optional and worth 2 doios each.

Activities will be both topic and health/ wellbeing focused. Evidence of this is required either in person or via email/ dojo. Staff will endeavour to add on dojos for homework as close to the hand in as possible but if this cannot be done, then by the end of each week.

Behaviour policy

Child following the school rules: Respectful, Ready, Kind, Safe

Verbal Reminder

Reminder of school values/ expectations.

Child stays on green

Any child who is not behaving in line with our expectations will always be given a reminder by staff. The adult makes them aware of their behaviour and the learner has a choice to do the right thing. The aim should be to keep things at this stage and to stay on green.

No more than 2 verbal reminders should be given for the same behaviour.

Reflection & Repair

3 minutes in the reflection area & use of restorative script.

Child moved to yellow.

Child has a final opportunity to change their behaviour and will spend 3 minutes in reflection. The member of staff will use a scripted intervention to support the child in getting back to green.

If behaviour subsequently improves the child should be moved back to green.

Consequence

10 minutes of next lunch/play time missed.

Child moved to red

Behaviour has not improved. A child at this stage will miss 10 minutes of their lunch/play time.

*Each session/ day is <u>new</u> and children won't remain on red once the 10 minutes time out has been completed.

A red card might be required without the prior stages for any behaviour deemed to be repetitive, particularly aggressive, offensive, dangerous, racist, homophobic or intentionally hurtful. Children at this stage will need to have a more in-depth discussion with the head/ deputy/ SLT to avoid the behaviour being repeated and parents will be informed.

Snack time



The children are asked if they would like to order a snack. It is bagel or toast, there is a charge. Please talk to your children.

They can bring their own healthy snack into school if they would like (no nuts please).

We do have the option of fruit in school which is free of charge.
