Monday 18th May

- **Pupils to arrive at Fulfen at 2:30am. Please do not arrive before this time.**
- Coach will depart promptly at 3am.
- There will a stop at services for breakfast and a comfort break.
- The coach will reach the ferry terminal in Dover for a 10:15 departure (check in at 8:15am).
- We should arrive in France for 12:45.
- Greeted at Chateau de Grande Romaine around 5:15pm.
- Evening activities (may include: disco, football, scavenger hunt, swimming, camp fire)



Tuesday 19th May

- Visit the market town of Brie.
- Afternoon of activities on site at Chateau de Grande Romaine.
- Evening entertainment on site.



Wednesday 20th May

- Day out at Disneyland Paris visiting both the park and the Walt Disney Studios park (now called Disney Adventure Park).
- We will be returning to centre at around 6pm where the children will have dinner and some free time/evening activities.



Thursday 21st May

- Eiffel Tower (climb to the second floor)
- Bateau Parisien
- Coach tour
- Evening activities on site.



Friday 22nd May

- Leave centre after breakfast - approximately 9am.
- Visit to hyper market for final souvenirs and snacks!
- Travel to Calais for ferry crossing.
- Check in at 1:55pm (French time).
- Depart Calais 3:55pm
- Arrival back in the U.K. 4:25pm (UK time)
- Stop at services for a meal.
- We hope the group will arrive back at Fulfen by 10pm. **However it is difficult to predict exactly what time we will arrive.**
- Please check School Spider from 6:30pm to check our arrival time.



Meals:

- Children require either packed meals for the outward journey **or** money to cover the cost of buying these – 1 for breakfast and 1 for lunch.
- A supply of cereal bars or similar snacks would be a good idea.
- All other meals during the stay are provided.
- Children will need money to cover the cost of a service station meal on the way home.
- **PLEASE BRING A STURDY RE-FILLABLE WATER BOTTLE**



Luggage:

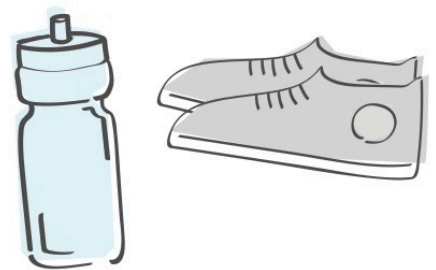
- Space for luggage is limited.
- Pupils are allowed **one large holdall or suitcase** to be kept in the luggage hold until we reach the centre.
- **One smaller shoulder bag/ rucksack** can be kept in the coach. This should contain their packed lunches and magazine, book, crossword or pocket game for the journey.



Please ensure that all items are named.

FOR ACTIVITIES

Clothes are likely to suffer wear and tear and also get dirty and / or wet, therefore you should bring **old clothes** for activities.

- Long sleeved T-shirts
- Leggings / jogging bottoms (no jeans)
- Fleeces / sweatshirts
- 1 pair old trainers that may get wet / muddy
- Waterproof jacket and trousers if you have them
- Old towel
- Swimming costume / trunks if you're planning to swim



YOU WILL ALSO NEED

- Food and a drink for your journey
- Pocket money 
- Any personal medication
- Towel for showering
- Underwear & socks 
- Suitable nightwear
- Labelled bin bag for wet and dirty clothing
- Washbag including soap, shampoo, toothbrush and toothpaste (please do not bring aerosols) 
- Torch
- Watch / alarm clock
- Insect repellent and bite cream

PLEASE DO NOT BRING

You do not have to bring bedding as all bedding is provided at your accommodation.



Clothing:

- Pupils will need comfortable clothing for the journey and for each day. The **weather can vary** so please bring layers to help keep warm if required but also suitable clothes if we experience a summer heatwave!
- Sensible shoes or trainers will be required as there will be **a lot of walking!**
- **A waterproof will be essential.**
- They will need two towels (one for showering and one for swimming) and toiletries; bedding is provided.

LOST PROPERTY

We recommend you write a list of what you pack to check before you come home. If you do leave anything behind, please contact your Party Leader who will contact PGL. Postage will be charged for returning lost items.

Pocket Money:

- All of the admission prices and leisure facilities are included in the price of the tour.
- Children may require pocket money for souvenirs and snacks.
- We suggest an amount of €70/80 (in €5 or €10 notes) but not more than around €120.
- This needs to be looked after by your child.
- Children can use cards such as Monzo, GoHenry etc but they are responsible for these. Please check your child's card will work in France before sending it. Please also check they know their PIN number!
- The staff will advise children as to how much money they should take each day but children will be responsible for this.



Further details:

- Cameras or any other electronic equipment are the responsibility of the individual child. **A disclaimer must be completed.**
- Names on everything would be extremely useful!
- **No mobile phones with SIM cards are to be taken.**
- We recommend not to take valuable and breakable possessions and electronics. Remember if you take them, you will need a travel adapter.
- Music players, handheld game consoles and so on can help pass the journey time but so can magazines, books and puzzles.
- There is no wifi available for children at the chateau or on the coach.



Insurance:

- We kindly request that your child's European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or new GHIC card is handed into school as soon as possible if not done already. We must have received your child's card and passport on **Wednesday 6th May**. These will be stored securely.
- These will be returned to you immediately after the tour.

- **Any medication to be handed in on the Monday morning, CLEARLY LABELLED WITH NAME AND DOSAGE** please including inhalers. No medication is to be sent with the children themselves, including travel sickness tablets.



Updates while we are away:

- During the visit, Fulfen staff will upload photos and updates from the Paris visit. These will be published to the Fulfen Facebook page.
- Children who do not have school photo permissions will not feature in photo updates from the residential.



Actions before we go:

- Bring passports and GHIC/EHIC into school on Wednesday 6th May. These will be kept in school, until the day of departure.
- If you wish for your child to have spending money, please arrange for this currency and no more than around €120.
- Consider purchasing a travel adaptor - this is essential for charging.
- Remember **two packed meals in disposable bags or money** for service station meals for the day of departure and a **re-usable water bottle**.
- Complete electronics disclaimer form by Thursday 14th May. (A link will be emailed out following this meeting)
- Prepare medication in a clear labelled bag
