As usual, this was a great success – here are a few photographs from the week:

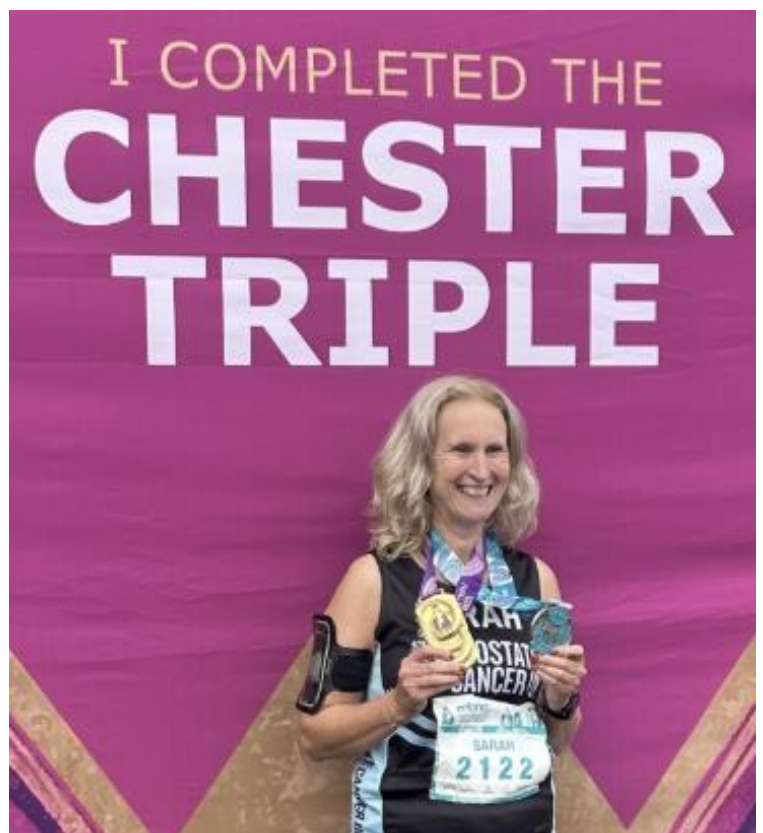


Mrs Shermer did it!

Snack

As you know, we've gone cashless for snack. Now that it's had time to settle, this new system seems to be working really effectively.

Did you know you can set up a top-up alert in ParentPay to remind you if the balance is getting low? It's simple:

- Log into ParentPay
- Go to "**Communications**"
- Go to "**Alert Settings**"
- Find "**Breaktime Snack Y1-6**" under **Balance Alerts**, set the threshold for when you want a reminder and tick the **email** box (emails are free!)
- Click "Save" at the bottom.



This should ensure that there are funds there for whenever your child orders snack. N.B. You can set up text alerts, but need to add to the text alert balance and each text cost 7p.

SEND Coffee Morning



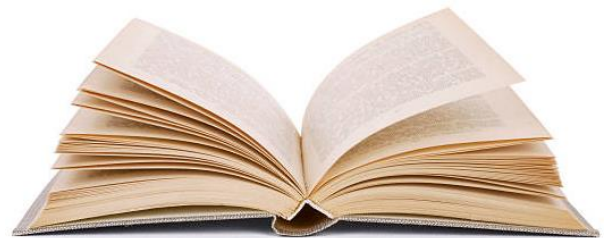
On Monday 19th January, we will be holding a SEND Coffee morning, which will be an informal opportunity for any parents of pupils with SEND to network.

Reading Workshops for Parents

Over the next couple of weeks, we'll be holding **Reading Workshops for parents** for children in KS2.



Reading is at the heart of everything we do and we want every child to develop a love of books as well as the skills and confidence to become fluent, thoughtful readers.

These short, after-school sessions will give you the chance to hear from your child's class teacher about how reading is taught and supported in school and how you can best help at home. Teachers will share practical ideas, recommended authors and texts and strategies to make reading at home more enjoyable and effective.

Whether your child is still developing fluency or already devouring chapter books, these sessions are designed to help every family support reading progress.

Trim Trail Being Installed!

This time last year, our LEAD Ambassadors shared their vision to create a trim trail on our school grounds that could be enjoyed by children across the school. Their aim was to develop an exciting and engaging space for play, teamwork and active fun. This is where our trim trail project first began.

With the guidance of Mrs N. Fierro-Hammond, planning for our new trim trail began. In the Spring term, a whole-school fundraising event raised over £5,000 (with Miss Davies and Miss Sturch showing great spirit as they were covered in custard!).

Our efforts continued and, following a successful grant application led by Mrs Steele and Mrs Fierro-Hammond, we were awarded an additional £4,500 from the Noel Sweeny Fund. After careful planning and design work, we are thrilled to confirm that the installation will take place at the end of this month!

While the all-weather surface remains part of our long-term goal, this will require around £14,000 in further funding. We would love to hear from any parents, local businesses or community groups interested in supporting this next stage.

A huge thank you to everyone who has donated, planned and believed in this exciting project—we can't wait to see our pupils enjoying the new space!



The Trim Trail will be installed at the end of November around our current tyres next to the KS2 playground and includes a balance beam, bridge, log traverse, scramble net, posts and double roll over bars.

Dear Parent/Guardian

Vision Screening/Eye Tests ARE NOT provided within schools.

We strongly recommend that all children have regular eye tests at an Optician once a year.

NHS Eye tests for ALL children are free at any Opticians.

It is important that even children with apparently normal vision should be tested. As children can often compensate very well for some eye problems which need to be identified and treated early to avoid lifelong visual loss.

The Eye test checks that your child's vision is developing normally. It is performed at this age so that any reduced vision or difference in vision between each eye can be picked up before the visual system is fully developed and any treatment can be started.

You do not need to do anything, if your child:

Is currently under the care of an Eye Specialist (Ophthalmologist / Orthoptist / Optometrist) at a Hospital Eye Clinic.

Or

Is currently under the care of a local Optometrist (Optician) or had a recent sight test.

If none of the above applies, please arrange with your local Opticians for your child to have a free NHS Eye Test.

Parent Governor Vacancies

We currently have **two vacancies** for **Parent Governors** on our school's governing body. I am writing to inform you of the election arrangements and to invite you to stand for election. Parent Governors are appointed for a period of up to four years, irrespective of whether their children remain at the school during that time.



Parents who are willing and eligible to stand as a candidate should complete this form: <https://forms.office.com/e/sY6QxwNTjH>

Please include a brief statement outlining what you would bring to the role. This statement will be shared with parents to help inform their vote. You will also need to provide the names of **two parents** who support your nomination.

Parents of all children currently registered at the school are entitled to stand for election or to nominate others. For these purposes, the term 'parent' includes a step-parent, guardian, or any other person with parental responsibility. *Please note: if you are employed at this school for more than 500 hours per year (i.e. more than one third of full-time hours), you are **not eligible** to stand for election. You are, however, still entitled to vote.*

Completed nomination forms must be returned to school **no later than Monday 17th November 2025**.

Following the closing date, all parents will receive a link to a ballot paper via School Spider, which will include details of each candidate. Parents will then be invited to cast their vote. To comply with statutory regulations, the ballot will be confidential.

The results will be shared with parents as soon as the votes have been counted.

What's on an iPad?

Our children's iPads are invaluable to support them with their learning! Not only do they use it as a tool within lessons to assist with accessing help or lesson content to support with their written work, but they also use them creatively, making digital artefacts to embed or extend their learning. Here is a selection of apps that we use in school:



Seesaw – Our digital journal where children upload and share their learning with parents – a great window into the classroom!



ChatterPix – Children can give any image a mouth, record their voice, and watch their creation speak – a fun way to present ideas or characters.



iMovie – Perfect for budding filmmakers! Children combine video, photos, text and sound to create their own short films or trailers.



Keynote – Like PowerPoint but more creative – used to design posters, presentations, animations and even short videos.



Clips – A fun video app where pupils can film, add text, emojis and music to bring learning to life.



Padlet – A shared online noticeboard where the whole class can post ideas, build vocabulary or collect resources together.



Pic Collage – A quick and colourful way to combine photos, text and backgrounds to present work beautifully.



Number Frames & Number Pieces – Visual maths tools that help children understand addition, subtraction and place value.



Sketchbook – A digital art studio for sketching, shading and experimenting with creative design.



Abacus & Arrow Cards – Interactive maths activities that build number sense and understanding of place value.



Hit the Button – Quick-fire maths games that challenge mental recall of number facts and times tables.



Arrays – Helps children visualise multiplication and division through clear array patterns.



Number Chart – A digital hundred square used for spotting patterns, counting and number investigations.



Geoboard – A hands-on tool for exploring 2D shapes, symmetry and angles through digital elastic bands and pins.

Other apps are added as needed; for example, Arduino to measure sound or light for science experiments.
