We are delighted to share that the installation of the trim trail is now complete, and we are currently preparing for the official opening, which will take place before half term. Our previous LEAD Ambassadors dedicated a great deal of time and effort to this project, with the aim of creating something special for the children of Fulfen for years to come. Alongside this, they wished for the trail to serve as a meaningful memorial to Max, a brave and much-loved member of our school community whom we sadly lost last academic year. Their vision was to create something joyful and lasting – a fun and loving space to remember Max and celebrate the happiness he brought to so many. This is how the 'Forever 7 Trail' came to be.

We would like to thank everyone who has supported the project so far and would especially like to recognise Mrs Ricketts, who organised a 'Walk for Max' event and raised an incredible £3,000, which she very kindly donated to the project. This generosity is greatly appreciated.

During the wetter months, use of the trail will be limited to help keep children safe and to prevent damage to the grassed surface. Our continued aim is for the Forever 7 Trail to have an all-weather surface so that it can be enjoyed throughout the year. As shared previously, this comes at a significant cost. We are incredibly proud that our current LEAD Ambassadors have already contributed to this goal by raising £526 through their Christmas raffle. We remain fully committed to the project and to securing the next stage of development.

We are excited for the Forever 7 Trail to be a place for play, laughter and remembrance, created with love by our school community.

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



## Important Notice About Parking By Our School

**ENOUGH IS ENOUGH!**

**Inconsiderate and illegal parking**

There is concern about inconsiderate and illegal parking in this area, which can contribute to accidents and injuries. We ask car users to take responsibility for their impact on the local community.

**DO NOT stop or park:**

- ✗ near a school entrance
- ✗ anywhere which prevents Emergency Services access
- ✗ opposite or within 10 metres of a junction, except in authorised parking spaces
- ✗ opposite a traffic island or, if this causes an obstruction, another parked vehicle
- ✗ where the kerb is lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility vehicles
- ✗ on a bend

Our school office are being overwhelmed by local residents complaining about poor and inconsiderate parking near our school. The police have been informed, as this behaviour is dangerous for our pupils, parents and members of our community.

Please do not obstruct pavements, park near junctions, or block driveways. We kindly ask all families to park considerately and legally, allowing safe access for pedestrians, pushchairs and emergency vehicles. Where possible, please consider parking a little further away and walking the final part of the journey.

By working together and showing consideration for our neighbours, we can help keep everyone safe and maintain positive relationships within our local community. Thank you for your cooperation and support.
