## Attendance

Attendance target 2024–25: **97.5%**. Currently school is at **96.9%**. Remember reduced % means 'Learning time lost'! A reminder that the chief medical officer encourages children to attend school if they have a cold, however if they have sickness, or diarrhoea, they need to remain absent for 48 hours after the last time this occurs. If your child has a temperature, they need to remain off school. Attendance as often as possible is important for your child.

**Punctuality:** It is important that you aim to be in school for the start time. This is 8.55am in Foundation Stage and 9am in Y1 and Y2. This is the time your child needs to be on the carpet, things put away ready for register and to learn, not when you are arriving at the entrance. Arriving late is disruptive to both your own child and the rest of the class. It is also likely your child will have missed some key learning for the day. This week **0.58%** of children were marked as late.

## Ask me about...

Each week your class teacher will update this area with information about what your child has been learning during the week so that you can ask them questions about it.

### Ladybirds

The Ladybirds have had a great week exploring our Traditional Tales topic. We have been retelling our story with music and actions as well as recreating the story in our role play area. We have been using our mathematical language to compare sizes and ordering objects by size.

We have continued our new P.E lessons in the hall this week. We had a great time being pirates, learning about moving around the space in different ways. We need to take off our shoes and socks for these lessons so it would be really helpful for the children to continue to practice this at home whenever they can.

### Foundation Stage Two (Otters, Mice and Badgers)

We have really enjoyed taking part in a Rugger Eds taster session this week. The children learnt how to attach their own tag belt and have taken part in different team games. The children were really pleased to take home a certificate.

The children have also been reflecting on our visit to the pantomime and have been designing and making their own character from the story Snow White. We used the TASC wheel in our classroom to plan out our design. We then used paint and a variety of mixed media to implement our designs. The children have evaluated their finished work

In maths, we have been learning to name different 3d shapes. We have spotted lots of 3d shapes in our classroom and around school.

We are hoping to enhance our construction areas in the next few weeks. If any families have any toy construction toys that are no longer used we would love to give them a new home.

We are also keen to restock our junk modelling areas with small boxes. You can pass these over to staff on the door.
