Update: Drop-off routine

Thank you for your support with the changes to our drop-off arrangements this week. We are pleased to say they have been a success, helping children to settle quickly and ensuring a calm, safe start to the day.

Most things will stay the same, with just a few minor adjustments from Monday:

Things staying the same

- Nursery – drop off at classroom
- Reception – drop off at classroom
- Year 1 – drop off at classroom
- Years 2, 3 and 6 –Year 2, 3 and 6 drop off area

Adjustments from Monday

- **Years 4 and 5** – children can now be brought to the **Year 2, 3 and 6 drop-off area**. A member of staff will be stationed on the football playground, clearly visible as children walk around to the Year 4/5 classrooms.



- Parents of Year 4 and 5 children may drop their child at the playground area **at the Year 2, 3 and 6 area**, where they will be seen through safely.
- If arriving via the main entrance, **Year 4 and 5 children** can be dropped off just inside the school gates (without being walked round) as a member of staff will be on duty at the entrance.

Important reminder

Children must not be dropped off outside the school gates, particularly on Brandon Avenue. They should be brought at least onto the main playground or just inside the main entrance gates so that we can be sure all children are safely in school.
