Attendance Matters

I know I mentioned attendance on the opening page—and I know I mention it every week—but it really does matter. Last week, our attendance was the lowest it has been since September 2024. Research shows that even small amounts of missed learning can have a noticeable impact: a single missed day often breaks a key link in a sequence of lessons, which then affects the rest of the week—not just that one day. We see this in school all the time. Children who miss just one phonics lesson can spend several sessions catching up on vital sounds; in maths, missing the introduction to a new concept can make later steps much harder; and in English, missing the start of a writing sequence can mean children return feeling unsure or behind their peers.

Please take note of NHS guidance, but as soon as your child is better, do make every effort to get them back into school. A mild sniffle or cough is absolutely fine to come in with, and your support makes a real difference at this key time of year. If you are ever unsure, please don't hesitate to call the school office for advice. Thank you for doing your bit to help us move back towards our 96% target.

Moving Mountains in Year 4

We are always looking for creative and inspirational ways to bring learning to life. In Year 4, the children have been exploring the topographical features of the Indus Valley—a clever way of describing the shape of the land, including how flat, hilly or mountainous it is. To deepen their understanding, they created their own mountain ranges on a map of the region using papier-mâché. It's been a fantastic hands-on project and just another example of what makes Prospect Vale such a special place to learn.





St George's Super Stars

It's a very special time of year, and there's nothing that makes it more magical than the opportunity to sing at St George's in Stockport. Viewed by hundreds of spectators, the Prospect Vale choir shone brightly with their performances alongside other local schools. They represented themselves beautifully on Tuesday evening and, although my view was slightly obscured by a pillar, it was still an incredibly special event to be part of.

This week, Year 2 achieved exactly that, and they had the most wonderful time doing it. The children showed great teamwork, listened carefully to safety instructions, and then enjoyed the magical moment of toasting marshmallows together in the crisp winter air. It was great fun, and a reminder of why these hands-on opportunities mean so much.
