# Important: Year 5 Swimming Reminders

Our Year 5 swimming sessions are a vital—and fun—part of the curriculum. However, to ensure these sessions run smoothly and every child gets their full time in the water, we need your support with a few essential requirements.

As a reminder, all pupils must be fully prepared each week. Please ensure your child follows these guidelines:

- **Swimming Kits:** Please double-check that your child has their full swimming kit with them every **Friday**.
- **Earrings & Jewellery:** For health and safety reasons, earrings **must** be removed before swimming. If your child cannot remove them themselves, please ensure they are taken out before they come to school on swimming days.
- **Advanced Notice:** If there is a medical reason why your child cannot swim, please provide a written note in advance so that we can plan accordingly.

When children arrive without kits or with earrings that cannot be removed, it can create significant disruption and requires us to make last-minute alternative arrangements. We want every child to benefit from these lessons, so thank you for your cooperation in helping us keep the focus on the swimming!
