# Stockport Songbook Performance



## A New Plan for our Big Celebration!

Last year, we had a fantastic Eid celebration in April. This year, we want to make the most of the (hopefully!) warmer Stockport sunshine by holding our main outdoor event—with food and music on the playground and field—for the second Eid (Eid al-Adha) in late May.

We will, of course, still be celebrating the first Eid in **March**. We are currently working with our friends at the local Mosque, who will be visiting to speak with the children about the significance of Ramadan and Eid. If you would like to be involved in our bigger outdoor festivities later in the year, we will keep you posted on how you can join in!

## Creating a Meaningful Ramadan Quiet Space

Throughout the holy month, we are proud to continue providing a dedicated **Quiet Space** for our pupils. This offers a calm, reflective environment away from the hustle and bustle of the lunchtime playground.

To make sure this space is as peaceful and effective as possible, we've been chatting with our friends at the Ethnic Diversity Service, who have supported our school for many years. With their expert friendly advice, we've shaped our plans for this year:

- **Year 5 & 6 Focus:** The space will be primarily for our older children, as they often have a deeper understanding of the commitment required for fasting and reflection.
- **A Balanced Routine (The 30/30 Split):** To support both their spiritual journey and their physical energy, pupils will spend 30 minutes in the quiet space and 30 minutes outside in the fresh air.
- **Younger Pupils:** If you feel your younger child needs to use this space, please encourage them to have a chat with Mr. Redfearn so we can look at their individual needs.

As always, my door is open. I've enjoyed speaking with our local community partners and local mosque about how to make these occasions special for the children. If you have anything you'd like to discuss, please do let me know.

**Note to Parents:** Keep an eye out for a letter in the coming weeks which will provide more detail on how we support and look after our pupils who are fasting during the school day.

A huge well done to Year 5 for their stellar efforts—you've certainly launched this topic with a bang!






## Snow Centre Splendour!
