Book Awards at Stockport Town Hall

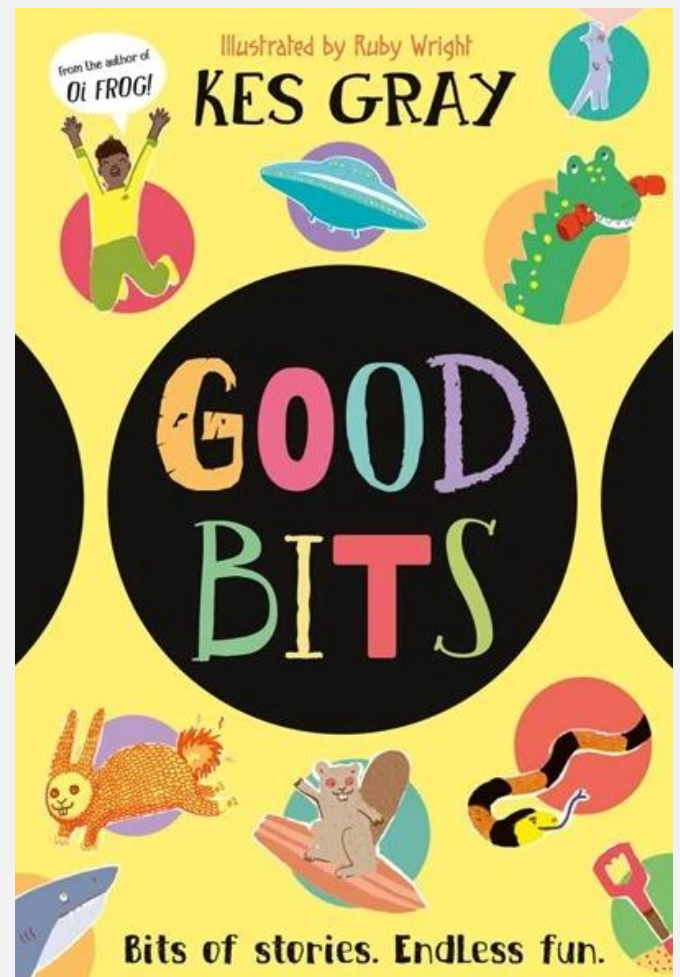
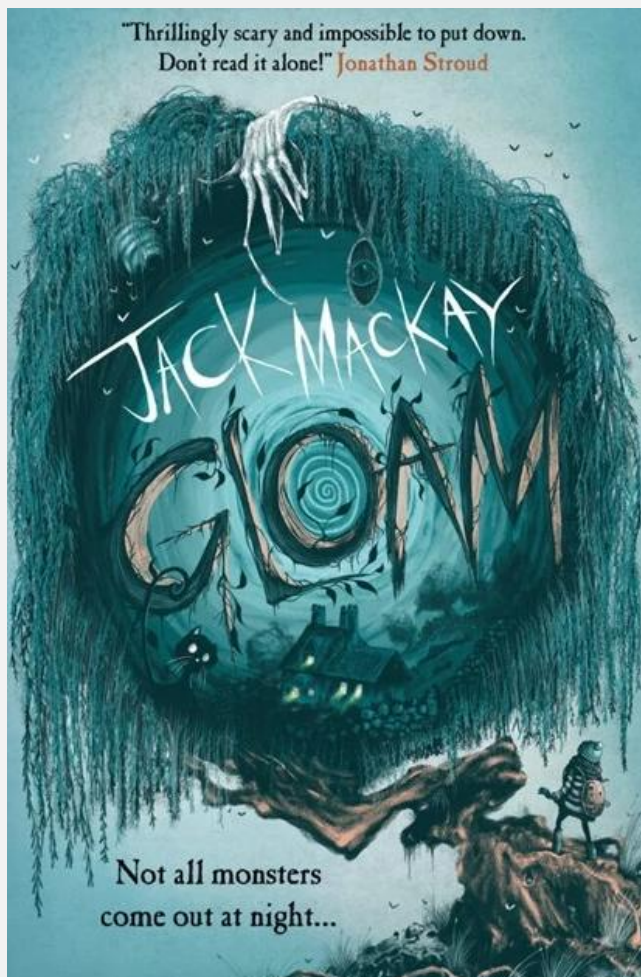
Seven children who have worked hard in our school library and been fantastic advocates for reading were invited to the Stockport Children's Book Awards at Stockport Town Hall.
