Mathematics:

- Recite numbers past 5
- Say one number for each item in order 1,2,3,4,5
- Compare sizes, weights etc using gesture and language "bigger/smaller/little" high/low"
- Climb and squeeze into different types of spaces
 Build with a range of resources

Literacy:

- Notice some print, such as the first letter of their name, a bus or door number, or familiar logo
- Enjoys drawing freely
- Make marks on their picture to stand for their name
- Develop play around favourite stories

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

- Develop their sense of responsibility and membership of a community
- Show more confidence in social situations
- Talk about their feelings using words like "happy" "sad" "angry" or "sad"

Communication and Language:

- Enjoy listening to longer stories and can remember much of what happens
- Understand a question or instruction that has two parts such as "Get your coat and wait at the door."
- Sing a large repertoire of songs
- Start a conversation with an adult or a friend and continue it for many turns
- Pay attention to more than one thing at a time, which can be difficult.

Physical Development:

- Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding and ball skills.
- Skip, hop, stand on one leg and hold a pose for a game like musical statues
- Start taking part in group activities.

Understanding the World:

- Make connections between the features of their family and other families.
- Notice differences between people
- Use all their senses in hands on exploration of natural materials
- Talk about what they see, using a wide vocabulary
