Our topic in the Autumn term is 'Ourselves'. During the Autumn Term we will be settling the children into their new learning environment and introducing them to the routines of Reception. During focused learning time we will be carrying out the Reception Baseline Assessment (RBA) and establishing their starting points. Once completed we will be exploring the theme of Autumn, Remembrance Day, Advent and Christmas. We will update you regularly through our weekly learning log.

Mathematics:

- Listen to number rhymes and stories.
- Counting to 10 and beyond
- Recognising numerals 1-5 and 6-10
- Naming and describing simple 2D Shapes.
- Creating simple repeated patterns and acknowledging the mistakes within them.

Literacy:

- Listening to a range of stories, rhymes and poems
- Daily name writing practice/name card introduction
- Introduction to formal Read Write Inc sessions.
- Ordering events within a story beginning/middle/end etc.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

Find solutions to conflicts and rivalries, for example, accepting that not everyone can be Spider-Man in the game, and suggesting other ideas.
 Increasingly follow rules, understanding why they are important
 Remember rules without needing an adult to remind them

Communication and Language:

- Developing friendships and vocabulary associated within it.
- Listen to and discuss events within stories.
- Develop an awareness of the listener's wants and needs

Physical Development:

- Begin to use correct pencil grip to form letters within their name
- Develop spacial awareness within the classroom/outdoor environment.
- Explore riding a range of different transportation (bikes/cycles etc)
- Manage needs independently hand washing/toileting
