Owls:

The Owls have had a fantastic start to the new half term! We have begun exploring our new English book—a fantasy adventure that is already inspiring plenty of imagination and excitement in the classroom. In Maths, both Year 3 and Year 4 are making excellent progress with multiplication and division. With a TT Rockstars tournament on the horizon, we encourage pupils to keep practising these skills at home!

Our Geography lessons have taken us to the Arctic Circle. Using atlases and Google Earth, the children have learnt where it is located and have begun to explore its unique climate. In PSHE, we have been discussing multiculturalism and the importance of showing respect to people from all backgrounds. The children have shared thoughtful ideas and shown great maturity.

Peregrines:

The Peregrines have had a fantastic week of learning! In English, the children have been busy crafting 100-word stories inspired by *The Lost Happy Endings*, using expanded noun phrases and dialogue with increasing accuracy and confidence. During PSHE, they have been exploring the important differences between unkind behaviour, teasing, and bullying, showing thoughtful discussion and empathy. In DT, the class is finalising their designs for their textile Christmas decorations. Our Year 5s are also excited about beginning their additional reading comprehension homework. Well done, Peregrines, for another brilliant week of hard work and enthusiasm!

Buzzards:

Buzzards have had a fantastic first two weeks back. It has been lovely to catch up with our friends after half term and to get back into the swing of learning. Buzzards have loved getting stuck into our new topic for History and for English: Black History. Already, they are having such mature conversations around the subject and giving such thoughtful responses. As mathematicians, we've been looking at fractions, exploring how fractions with different denominators can be compared. Buzzards have also enjoyed stepping up this week in their roles as buddies and as members of our pupil parliament. They enjoyed a lovely afternoon with their buddies on Tuesday, creating beautiful remembrance-themed artwork and have also spent an afternoon with Mr Bell coming up with amazing ideas for the school with their minister hats on!





Sparrowhawks:

Sparrowhawks have had a lovely 2 weeks settling back after the week holiday. We started last week with a workshop from SCARF learning about how we can keep our bodies healthy with the help of Gerald the giraffe. This week we continued our PSED learning with a session on bullying and kindness. We have been learning about Guy Fawkes and bonfire night, exploring the reason we have bonfire night and how it is celebrated - the children did some great work in the continuous provision drawing fireworks, creating the houses of parliament, retelling the story with puppets and doing sketches. We have been continuing our science investigation into which material would make the best umbrella using planning skills to create an experiment. We have also started to explore how materials can be changes (making Christmas decorations from salt dough!) We have developed some lovely artwork based on the story of The Leaf Thief. As we move into a new month, we have been taking the opportunity to learn about the months of the year and also find out when all our birthdays are.

There has been great excitement this week with the introduction of our new book - Nibbles the paper monster! He likes to nibble paper so please watch out for him at home!



Kestrels:

We've had another fantastic week in Kestrels. We have been thinking about peace and what it means to us. Our buddies joined us on Remembrance Day to do some shared poppy artwork. There has been a great deal of imaginative play in all the learning areas both within and outside the classroom. We have had brilliant fun in Drawing Club this week and our writing about the Troll in the Billy Goats Gruff story was just amazing!

School Attendance – a new target!

The Department of Education have this week issued every school in England a 'minimum expected attendance improvement' target. This is to reflect their strong view that school attendance is one of the biggest factors in children achieving at school. I strongly support this view. Our baseline target has been set at 0.3% above our attendance figure from the last academic year. This means that our whole school attendance target from the government is 96.7%. This is something I think we should aim to exceed, to ensure our children reach their full potential. I am therefore sharing with you all that our new Ashton Hayes Primary School attendance target for this year is 97%. To help us achieve this, please do all you can to make sure your child is in school every day and on time. Thank you for all of your current efforts in regards to this.

Breaktime Snack Trial – An Update for Families

As you will already be aware, through communication from Mrs Stubbs, we have made some to our breaktime snacks this term.

The rationale for making this change is mainly twofold. Firstly, In the past, our staff prepared toast and bagels for the children each morning. While this worked well in many ways, it meant staff were needed away from their usual roles every day, which was impacting on our core work, of supporting our children and families. Additionally, we also felt that if we were to make a change, it was a good time to trial a little more choice at breaktime.

To help with this, our school caterers, Edsential, are now preparing our snack options for us, just as they already do with our school lunches.

Healthy Snacks That Meet National Standards

All of the snacks during this trial meet the DfE School Food Standards, which simply means they:

- Support healthy eating
- Avoid foods high in fat, salt and sugar
- Only allow drinks such as water, milk or permitted low-sugar options

We've made sure everything on offer fits these guidelines.

What's on the Snack Menu?

Children now have a wider choice at breaktime, including:

• Flavoured milk ("milkshakes") – These are small (200ml) cartons of flavoured low-fat milk with no added sugar.



Strawberry: 99% low-fat milk

Chocolate: 98% low-fat milk

- Small fruit drink A 125ml drink made entirely from fruit juice from concentrate, with no other added ingredients.
- Toast or bagels Still available as part of the weekly snack offer.
- Friday treat A bacon sandwich option is available every Friday as a special end-of-week treat.

Everything provided by Edsential follows the national food standards for schools.

You Still Have the Choice

We want to reassure parents that children, of course, can still bring their own snack from home if you'd prefer. The school-provided snack is completely optional — the aim of the trial is simply to give families more choice and flexibility, not to replace what you already do (as well as to free up our staff to do the job that I think is most important).

Trial Until December - We'd Love Your Feedback

We'll be running this trial until the end of December. After that, we'll ask for parent feedback to help us decide how best to move forward.
