## Uniform Policy

For safeguarding purposes, Trinity St. Peter's CE School policy is that all children wear school uniform when attending school, representing the school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours unless otherwise stated.

We believe that having a school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- engenders a sense of community and belonging;
- is practical, smart, and appropriate for learning;
- clearly identifies children as members of Trinity St Peter's CE School;
- prevents distraction caused by fashion clothing;
- supports equality by ensuring children feel the same as their peers in terms of appearance;
- represents good value for money for families;
- is designed with health and safety in mind.

We ask that all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children to school appropriately dressed and ready for school. One of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child wears a clean and in good repair uniform throughout their time at Trinity St Peter's. Equally, that their child's hair is clean and is appropriately styled for school.

We want our children to come to school feeling comfortable and ready to learn. Therefore, children can come to school in Key Stage 1 and 2 wearing either the traditionally named: 'Winter' 'Summer' or school PE kit (regardless of PE days)

### **Nursery and Reception Uniform:**

**Charcoal** grey jogging top **with school logo on jumper** and full-length joggers or

**Charcoal** knee length joggers with **school logo**

Plain yellow polo shirt (unbranded)

Charcoal grey socks

Plain black shoes or trainers (unbranded)

### **Year 1 to Year 6 Uniform:**

**Charcoal** grey 'V' neck jumper, tank top or cardigan

Grey knee length short or long trousers, culottes, skirt or pinafore

Yellow and white gingham dress /skorts

White shirt/blouse and school tie

White reversed collar shirt/blouse and 'optional' school tie

Plain yellow polo shirt (unbranded)

Charcoal grey socks or tights and black shoes (not boot style or pumps)

### **PE Kit:**

**Charcoal 'V' neck grey sweat shirt with school logo**

**Charcoal grey jogging pants/leggings (not black leggings)**

White T shirt or White Polo shirt (unbranded)

Black shorts (not black leggings) or skorts

White socks and suitable trainers preferably plain black

The school jogging suit top, tie and book bag can only be purchased from Whittakers in Southport or from Team TSP's preloved Uniform shop.

All other items can be bought elsewhere.

### **Hair and Appearance**

We ask that all children attend school with hair that is clean, neat and suitable for a learning environment. Hair that is shoulder length or longer should be tied back for comfort, safety and to support learning.

Hairstyles and hair accessories should be modest and appropriate for school. Styles or accessories that are overly exaggerated or distracting, including tramlines and holiday braids, are not permitted.

### **Jewellery**

For health and safety reasons, children are not permitted to wear jewellery in school. The only exception to this rule is small, plain stud earrings worn in pierced ears.

Children must remove earrings for all PE and games activities. Where removal is not possible, earrings must be covered with a plaster provided by the parent or carer.

Please note that **earrings must not be worn for school swimming lessons under any circumstances.**

## **Additional Information**

- All items of uniform must be clearly labelled.
- Children should not wear nail varnish, false/gel nails or makeup to school.
- No smart watches should be worn.
- Children who choose to attend school in Summer or Winter uniform on PE days must bring their PE kit to school for that day.

Parents and carers are politely reminded to consult with the school if a modification to uniform is required for their child, for example due to medical, cultural, or religious reasons.

Where uniform choices do not comply with school policy, parents and carers will, in the first instance, be informed by their child's class teacher.

If non-compliance continues, the matter will be referred to the Headteacher or, in their absence, a member of the Senior Leadership Team. Repeated failure to comply with the policy may be referred to the school's governing body.
