Ensure our child/children do not wear smartwatches, AirTags or other tracking devices in school or on school visits
Year 6 pupils who walk to and from school by themselves can bring mobile phones to school upon reading, completing and returning the Mobile Phone Agreement;
Model respect, kindness and positive communication in all interactions with members of the school community;
Work collaboratively with school staff to ensure Trinity St Peter's remains a happy, safe and thriving community for all.
