HELPING AT HOME

School crams as much as possible into the school day however there is much you can do at home to help and support your child's learning. Research shows that when school and home work together and children are supported in their learning at home, they do better academically than those children who solely rely on school.

Times Tables Rockstars

Times tables are the KEY to mathematical success so please encourage your child to access this at least **3 times a week.**

Reading

Please hear you child read from their reading book at least **3 times a week**. In addition to this read a story from a reading from pleasure book to your child daily.

Spelling

Your child will be set spellings to learn each week and will be tested the following week. Please ensure that your child learns these. The interactive website 'Spelling Shed' has your child's spellings featured and allows them to be learnt and tested at home using any web based device. Practice with them and test them so they know how many they know before their spelling test.

PE DAYS—Please ensure your child comes in the correct PE kit and NOT own clothes. PE kit—Plain white t shirt, with or without collar, with or without logo. Navy, black, grey leggings or jogging bottoms. Navy sweatshirt, with or without logo. A pair of plimsoles WITHOUT black soles to be kept IN school, in a pump bag for indoor PE. A pair of sensible trainers to be worn for school on outdoor PE days. A pair of navy, black, grey shorts for indoor PE days.
