SCHOOL OFFICE - CONTACT - GENTLE REMINDER

To help protect valuable learning time and ensure our children can concentrate fully, we are adjusting how we manage calls and early pick-ups during the school day.

Our teachers and school leaders have highlighted that frequent, non-urgent interruptions to the classroom are disrupting lessons and impacting children's focus. We want every minute in the classroom to count!

What This Means Going Forward:

Protecting Lessons: The school office will no longer disturb a classroom unless it is a genuine emergency or a pre-arranged pick-up that was communicated well in advance.

Please remember: We will not call the classroom for non-urgent requests like "checking on a child." If there is a problem or an urgent issue with your child, we will contact you immediately.

Managing Early Pick-Ups: If you need to collect your child early for an appointment that wasn't planned ahead of time:

Please check in at the school office as usual.

However, an office staff member will now wait for the next transition time (like the end of a lesson) before collecting your child. This prevents the learning from being stopped abruptly.

Please be prepared to wait for this transition while we retrieve your child respectfully. The time you wait will depend on where in the lesson the children are.

Thank you for helping us make sure every child has the best possible environment for learning!

ZONES OF REGULATION – EXPLORING THE GREEN ZONE

Last week we moved onto THE GREEN ZONE - The JUST RIGHT Zone.

How to spot The Green Zone:

Children learned that when they are in The Green Zone, when they are:


- Smiling, breathing calmly and their muscles are relaxed
- Speaking with a steady and respectful voice
- Able to listen and respond
- ▶ Show interest in others and the world around them
- Sit and play nicely
- ▶ Calm, content and happy
- ▶ Able to complete tasks

Tools for The Green Zone:

The children worked on exploring ways to help them stay calm, focussed and feeling good. Some of the tools the children added to their toolbox this week included:

- Utilising mindfulness breaks
- Incorporating movement and physical activity into their routines
- Staying hydrated and drinking water
- ▶ Listening to calming music
- Finding a quiet space
- Having a grown up (your trusted adult) checking in on you
- ▶ Most importantly of all...HAVE ENOUGH GOOD QUALITY SLEEP
- ▶ **Remember:** All feelings are okay! The goal isn't to be in the Green Zone (calm, happy, and focused) all the time. It's about learning what zone we are in and how to manage our feelings to help us get back to a calm state.

We encourage you to try some of these strategies at home and use the "GREEN Zone" language with your child. Be kind to yourselves and to others!
