Bobby Zones are designated areas around schools aimed at enhancing road safety for children. Established in memory of six-year-old Bobby Colleran, who tragically lost his life in a road accident near his school in Liverpool in 2014, these zones are part of the initiatives by The Bobby Colleran Trust to prevent such incidents.

The aim of these measures is to create a safer environment around schools, reducing the likelihood of accidents and ensuring the well-being of students. The Bobby Colleran Trust aspires to implement a 20 mph Bobby Zone outside every school in the country, promoting consistent road safety standards nationwide.





STICK TO THE SPEED LIMIT

A maximum speed limit of 20 mph is enforced within the zone to ensure drivers maintain a safe speed near schools.

NO STOPPING OR PARKING

Drivers are prohibited from dropping off or picking up children within the Bobby Zone, even if traffic is stationary. Parking on pavements is also forbidden, as it can force pedestrians onto the road, increasing the risk of accidents





STAY VIGILANT

Motorists are urged to be extra cautious, recognising that the area is populated with children and families during school hours.
