The Children's Commissioner has written to schools as she is conducting the two largest ever children's surveys - The Big Ask and The Big Ambition.

Now, for the first time, hundreds of thousands of children will be eligible to vote in the next general election, the biggest change to the franchise in half a century. Yet just one in five children say politicians listen to them. That's why she is launching her final survey, The Big Future.

She is asking children about the changes they want to see in their communities, their biggest concerns, and their hopes for the future. More than anything, she wants to know what they think a good childhood should look like today.

She is asking schools to share the survey with all the children, parents and carers in our school or college community. Schools and colleges that achieve high participation rates will receive formal recognition for their contribution to amplifying children's voices and encouraging civic engagement, and a summary of their pupils' responses.

She will be publishing her findings next year, and they will be used to advocate at the highest level for solutions that children want to see, to the problems that they tell her are most important to them.
