English

This term we will be reading and re-telling the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. We will be finding out about Bees and writing information texts. When writing and reading, the children will need to ...

- Say and write a series of simple sentences leaving finger spaces and using capital letters and full stops correctly.
- Use capital letters for names of people and places.
- Use 'and' to join words and sentences.
- Orally rehearse and retell familiar stories in sequence.
- Spell many common expectation words for Y1 correctly.
- Recall what has been read and discuss.
- Apply phonic knowledge to decode words and to spell.
- Form all letters using the correct pattern, showing clear ascenders and descenders.

Mathematics

- Count to 100 forwards and backwards and from different starting points.
- Count forwards and backwards in 2s, 5s and 10s
- Compose and partition numbers to 10.
- Know and instantly recall all addition facts within 10
- Place numbers within 100 along a number line.
- Solve missing numbers in addition and subtraction equations.
- Know the properties of 2D and 3D shapes.
- Add small amounts of money.

Science- Growing Plants.

- Know that plants grow from seeds.
- Find and identify a range of common plants in our school grounds.
- Identify and name common deciduous and evergreen trees.
- Name and label the parts of a flowering plant.
- Investigate the conditions for seed germination and plant growth.
- Explore the changing seasons and the record the weather.
- Gather and record information to find answers to questions.

Geography – Buzzing Bees and our local environment.

<u>Our theme this term will centre on how our local environment supports the habitat of Bees.</u> <u>We will ...</u>

- Explore our local environment and the range of habitats in our school grounds.
- Learn that different habitats meet the needs of different animals and plants.
- Think about the importance of conservation of flowering habitats for bees.
- Observe changes over time in our school grounds.
- Learn about the role of pollinators in the environment and how we can create habitats for them.
