World View : What do religious and non-religious world views believe about equality, justice and fairness?

Key vocabulary

discrimination	When someone is treated unfairly or differently because of who they are or a quality they have.
equality	When everyone is treated fairly and has the same opportunities, regardless of their differences.
fairness	The quality of treating people equally or in a way that is right or reasonable.
justice	Fairness in how people are treated.
prejudice	An unreasonable or unfair opinion or feeling about a person or group based on their membership in a particular group, such as their race, gender, religion or other identity.
racism	When someone treats someone differently because of the colour of their skin, the language they speak or where they come from.



Key knowledge:

- The United Nations Declaration of Human Rights is a document that outlines the fundamental rights and freedoms that all people are entitled to.
- The Equality Act 2010 is a law that protects people from discrimination, harassment, and victimisation in many areas of life, including education, housing, and work.
- Most world views and religions have the same opinion about equality. Most believe that everyone is equal and that people should treat others as they would like to be treated.
- Most people have access to some sort of social media. Social media can be used to spread fake news and inequalities.
- Most world views and religions believe that we are more successful when we are united and work together.

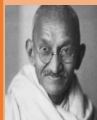
Jo Cox
