
In maths we will be building on your place value skills and will also begin to develop our knowledge of addition and subtraction. Within place value, we will focus on working with number to 1000: comparing and ordering; and finding 1, 10 and 100 more or less. Once we have developed our knowledge of numbers to 1000, we will then begin to look at developing our formal written methods for adding and subtracting numbers to 1000. We will also continue to develop our times table knowledge throughout the term.



Our topic is **Water, Water Everywhere**, and we will be exploring this in **Geography** through learning about the regions of the UK, and through studying the water cycle and the Arctic Circle.

In **science** we will learn about animals and humans in our first topic. We will learn all about skeletons, muscles, and the nutrition that we need to be healthy.

In **R.E.** we will be learning about Hinduism. We will be finding out about how Hindus view God and about how Diwali is celebrated. Closer to Christmas, we will continue to develop our knowledge of different world religions through learning about the Baha'i faith.



In **art** we will learn about creating abstract sculptures through use of shape and space. In **DT** we will be learning about creating a wearable watch.



In **music** we will be learning all about the power of ballads. Within this unit we will look at developing our singing and making compositions. We will then look at creating our own compositions in response to a stimulus.



This will be our first term studying **French**, so we will begin by learning greetings and will then develop number knowledge and colours.



In **P.E** we will be covering games: tag rugby and football. Through these units, we will work on our team skills and our understanding of the rules.

In **computing** we will be learning about how digital devices work, how they help us and how they are all connected. Then, in the run up to Christmas, we will be finding out how to create our own stop motion animations.
