What we are learning

English

In English, we will be using the book, 'The Promise' to drive our writing. Using high quality texts is a great way to engage the children as well as exposing them to a wide range of vocabulary and sentence structure.

Each day, the children will have an opportunity to read independently. This is to help their fluency and continue to promote a love for reading. In class, we have a wide range of ageappropriate texts for the children to choose to read. As well as this, the children will be read to by an adult, daily.

We will be promoting a love for reading throughout our wider curriculum by giving the children texts to extend their learning.

Maths

During the first half-term, your child will be revisiting and extending their understanding of number and place value. This will provide them with the foundation to enhance their mathematical understanding, when learning new concepts. The lessons are sequenced so that the children are developing their fluency and will solve a range of problems, showing that they have a secure understanding of what has been taught.

Geography

This half-term, we will be studying what life is like in the Alps. Within this topic, the children will use geographical skills to locate places on a map, study the human and physical geography of the Alps and will compare it to their local area.
