# **English**

Our English learning this half term focusses persuasive writing and narrative writing. Guided Reading sessions will continue to take place daily. This is where we practise and develop key reading skills. Within these reading lessons, we will be exploring the text 'Fortunately the milk'. These skills will be applied through the week in a range of different ways.

Grammar sessions will support our English learning, giving new knowledge that can be applied in our writing.

We ask that you continue to encourage your child to read at home as often as possible but at a minimum of three times a week and for you to comment in their Reading Record.

- To use a variety of sources to find out what life was like during Anglo-Saxon times

### General Reminders
