
My child does well at this school.



The school lets me know how my child is doing i.e. pupil reports, parents open days, Topic celebrations, Parents Evenings





Allocation of outside agencies - I find it absurd for all EP time to be allocated at the start of the year for the whole academic year without considering new EYFS intake and any in-year admissions (though school were made aware in June transition meeting held by the EP that there was EP involvement). Same for SALT. Prioritisation went to EHCP Children who should be regularly reviewed as per plan, but new intake already on the caseload not down for review until 7 months in to school year, especially for a reluctant speaker, not prioritising them as a transitional review is poor. As a parent, I shouldn't be having to chase and contact these outside agencies (but I always will if the SENCo isn't).
